
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


LINCOLN SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR 2024

This story encourages children to create a more welcoming and enjoyable playground environment for everyone.

At home, you can encourage inclusion by asking your student to learn a new friend's name and share their experiences. Foster problem-solving by discussing challenges and finding solutions. Model empathy and perspective-taking during your interactions. Help your student build and maintain healthy friendships based on trust, respect, and empathy. Invite a child your student doesn't know well to a playdate. This encourages them to step outside their comfort zone and make new connections!
