


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OCTOBER PTA NEWS

In November and December, we will read <u>Simon's Hook</u>, a story about a boy named Simon who



gets teased by his friends about his haircut Feeling sad and frustrated, he confides in his Grandma Rose who shares a creative story about fish and "hooks" to help Simon understand <u>how to deal with teasing</u>. Simon learns different strategies to avoid being hurt by teasing and is empowered to handle teasing in a positive way. This story helps children understand how their words and actions can affect others and also equips them with tools to navigate challenging social situations. Ask your child what the tools in the book mean: ignore, agree & deflect, change the subject. Show your student how you manage minor annoyances or frustrations without getting upset, and explain that some things are just not worth getting worked up
